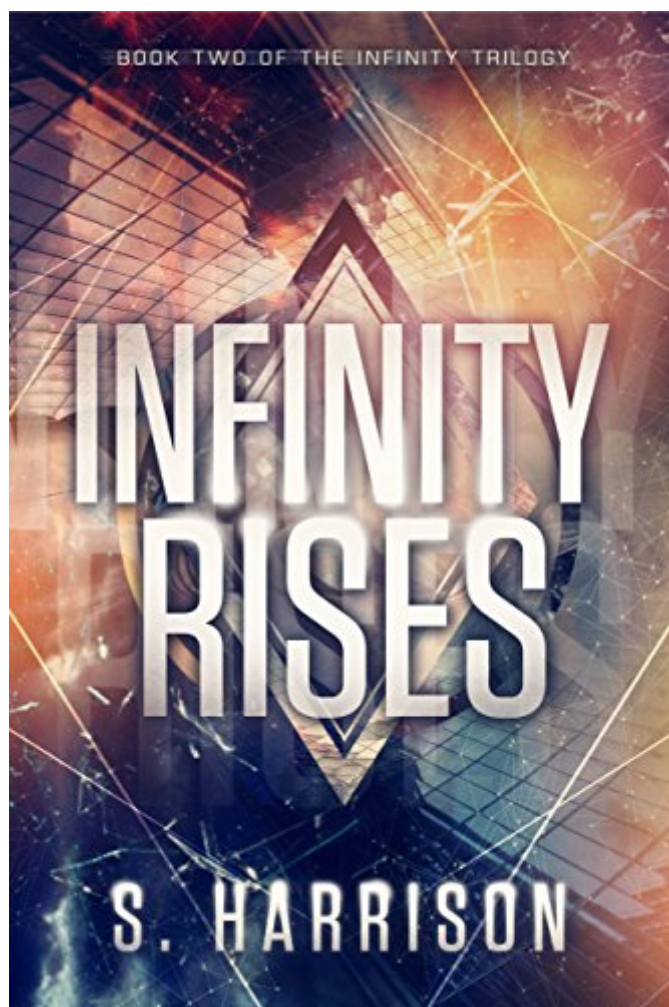


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Infinity Rises (The Infinity Trilogy Book 2)

I don't know why I continued to read this. It seems to be nothing but blood, gore and totally unbelievable stuff, over and over. I do not understand why Infinity wants to kill the man who is supposed to be her father. But chapter after chapter is filled with desperate fighting with drones who are part of the complex she and her comrades are visiting and now desperately trying to escape.

Clearly, Mr. Harrison is a veteran gamer. This and the first book in the series read like a video game script. He skips over character development and gets straight to the violent scenes imbued with weird superpowers belonging to a genetically-modified, brainwashed teenager. I will not likely purchase the third installment.

I really loved the first book in this trilogy, Infinity Lost, and even pre purchased this book early because I couldn't wait to read more. The first book was creative and fast paced and enjoyable. This

book, however, was poorly written on so many levels. There was no believable character development, a lack of creativity in general plot and themes and even a lack of variety of word choice. As a result, I was unable to develop even a shred of empathy for any of the characters. It felt like the author put a lot of time, effort, and creative spirit into the first book and then rushed to get this book to print, thereby sacrificing critical elements of good storytelling. There is a very low likelihood of me buying book 3.

Not quite as good as the first one but still a fun read. Actually, I am not a fan of science fiction type stories yet I continue to read this trilogy. I think that speaks volumes to the storyline and the characters. I will read the last installment when it is released as well. I'm looking forward to it.
